Hearing care that includes family and communication partners supports better outcomes.



Family involvement strengthens follow-through and consistent device use.



Family participation provides a fuller understanding of communication and emotional needs, enabling more individualized care.

Practice tips for hearing care professionals



Facilitate, don't fix

Empower clients to take charge of their hearing health by building their knowledge, confidence, and self-management skills.



Share decisions and goals

Present all care options — including the choice to wait — and agree on goals that reflect what matters most to the client.



Engage family and partners

Involve family members or communication partners (with client consent) during assessments, goal setting, and follow-up to support better outcomes.



Deliver clear, manageable information

Give information in small, easy-to-understand parts. Make sure the person understands each part before moving on. This helps them feel confident and make informed decision.
